The Nevada County Food and Toy Run will take place on Saturday, December 10th. Our Chapter has participated in this worthwhile and fun event for several years.

If you haven't been on it before just ask some of the members who have. Lots of fun!

For those who would like to join us for breakfast before the ride, meet at 8:30am at the IHOP restaurant, 746 Taylorville Rd, Grass Valley. The rest of the group will meet at 10:00am in the Kmart parking lot at 111 W. McKnight Way, Grass Valley. Take the McKnight Way exit on HWY 49 and go west over the freeway. We will leave from that location as a group and ride up to the Nevada County Sheriff's Office parking lot in Nevada City where we'll join the other riders. There could be as many as 1,500 other motorcycles, however, our Chapter is always placed at the front of the ride. This event has been going on for more than 20 years. The

California Highway Patrol, Nevada County Sheriff Office, Nevada City Police Department, and Grass Valley Police Department do a fantastic job of traffic and crowd control which makes it a fun and safe ride. We will be escorted by law enforcement officers from the beginning to the end of the ride which goes through the small towns of Nevada City and Grass Valley, ending at the Nevada County Fairgrounds where we drop off the toys and canned food. Plan to see hundreds of families and children smiling, clapping and holding up signs along the way thanking us.

Several of us decorate our motorcycles with Christmas decorations...that's of course your choice to make. Remember to wear your Blue Knights Vest and or Blue Knights jacket and bring an unwrapped toy or 2 and some canned foods to drop off at the end of the ride.
